Statement of Purpose: The Minnesota Association for Developmental Education promotes professional development in practice and research to improve college readiness and student learning through innovations in the field of developmental education.

The Mini-Grants program awards grants of up to \$500 to current MNADE members who are faculty and staff of regional (Minnesota) colleges, schools, universities, departments, programs, and centers in support of teaching and research in developmental education.

Criteria: Proposals will be judged primarily on their relevance to developmental education and their level of innovation and potential to make a direct impact.

Date Due: December 1, or April 1, before 4:30 p.m. of each academic year. Application form and guidelines can be accessed at <http://www.mnade.org>

Process: Applicants should answer the application questions in two pages or less. Applicants receiving mini-grants in this round will be notified via email within a month of application after the Board meets to review proposals.
